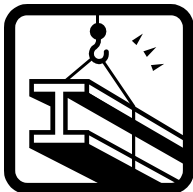


One of the best ways to avoid construction disputes is through education.

Georgetown University Law Center. Veronica is currently licensed to practice law in the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia.

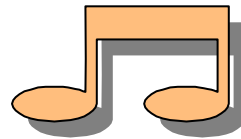


Entertainment Law Basics
